

Each delegation has been given an individual goal that is relevant to their constituency. However, each participant is also responsible for working towards a consensus meeting outcome that, as far as possible, meets the overall group goal, which is:

- To negotiate a statement on the urgency of tackling climate change that reflects the latest (2013) IPCC assessment and a commensurate realistic response, taking into account global economic circumstances and differences. To set a global target on GHG emissions for the 2030-2034 period that will avoid dangerous climate change (with 90% or higher confidence). Note: GHG emissions should be expressed as CO<sub>2</sub> equivalent (ie the total emissions with other gases converted to CO<sub>2</sub> equivalent, CO<sub>2</sub>e). To provide conference media statements before and at conclusion of conference.
- Each delegation is responsible for deciding how best they can achieve the compromises necessary to achieve a reasonably balanced outcome from their point of view - this includes consideration of negotiation with others, and what implementation actions can be factored into the declaration that would realistically work.
- Each delegation needs to prepare a 1 page position statement (preamble, targets and implementation) – by the 10<sup>th</sup> of June (by 5pm - send to the media team). The positions will be collated by the media and secretariat team into a draft document. This document will form the basis of the negotiation session and will be circulated at the beginning of the winter school to all parties.
